Arnie has purchased 20 BoC logo button that should be included in any of the boxes we make for the program, and they will be available for sale at the next club meeting. Arnie has also made contact with his local woodturners club, and we should be able to add our completed boxes to theirs for delivery to Baystate Hospital in Springfield, MA. This program just might be one of our most successful attempts at community involvement.
